#### **EDROLO for VCE Students**

#### How do students use Edrolo?

Edrolo is currently used by over 500 schools and 60,000 students. - Assessment preparation; and
- Exam revision.

#### ESSENTIAL / OPTIONAL ITEMS

#### **BOOKLISTS and E-BOOKS**

The booklists for students in years 7-10 in 2018 will include e-books instead of textbooks for core subjects. The College has negotiated a discounted price of \$120 with Jacaranda for the full suite of e-books. Teachers will train the students on how to use the e-books in class. Please ensure your child has a laptop computer ready for 2018 and they bring it with them to school every day.

Computers are available via the CentreCom portal at <u>https://eduportal.centrecom.com.au/Account/Signin</u> and use our school identification code *vusc8891*. Booklists for 2018 for all year levels are available at the office. Books may be collected from Campion at the Junior Campus in C-Block on **Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> January from 10am-3pm**. #### Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF)

To be eligible for the CSEF fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government school must be a holder of either a Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC).

The CSEF Payment amount for students in Secondary school's is \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

CSEF must be applied for every year. Forms are available at each campus office and must be returned to the General Office of either campus with the original HCC/PCC. <u>Applications must be received by 29<sup>th</sup> June 2018.</u>

Just a reminder for Year 12 students:VCE results and ATAR15 December (7am)Round 1 offers16 January 2018

The Careers team will be available on 15 December and from 18-20 December to assist with Change of Preference procedures. Tertiary institutions also offer advice beginning on December 15. The advice from VTAC is to always accept a first round offer. Accepting a first round offer does NOT stop you from getting additional offers higher up on your preference list. It should be noted that the vast majority of offers occur in round one. Students should consult the VTAC website under "Latest News" for relevant information.

As per the letter distributed in October, Mr Bertagnolio will be available on 19 January between 10.30a.m.-2.30p.m. at the Senior Campus to answer any questions regarding first round offers.

### **DET Student Scholarships 2018**

Students in Years 4 – 12 are invited to apply for student scholarships administered by the Department of Education and Training. The scholarships are now open and range in value from \$300 to \$2580. Applicants will be required to submit their 2017 end-of-year results, which must be verified by their Principal.

Many of the scholarships identify financial need as an eligibility criterion. Students on Youth Allowance, or whose parents/guardians hold a Health Care Card, a Low Income Health Care Card or a Pensioner Concession Card, meet this criterion.
